THE SALE

CERTIFICATES OFFERED FOR SALE AT COMPETITIVE BIDDING . . . The City of Bryan, Texas (the “City”) is offering for sale its \$65,430,000* Combination Tax and Revenue Certificates of Obligation, Series 2026 (the “Certificates”).

ADDRESS OF BIDS . . . Sealed bids, plainly marked “Bid for Certificates”, should be addressed to the “Mayor, City of Bryan”, and delivered to the Financial Advisor, Specialized Public Finance Inc., 4925 Greenville Avenue, Suite 1350, Dallas, Texas 75206, prior to 9:30 AM, Central Time, on the date of the bid opening. All bids must be submitted on the Official Bid Form in the form attached hereto, without alteration or interlineation.

ELECTRONIC BIDDING PROCEDURE . . . Any prospective bidder that intends to submit an electronic bid must submit its electronic bid through the facilities of PARITY. Bidders must submit, prior to 9:30 AM, Central Time on the date of the bid opening, a SIGNED Official Bid Form to Steven Adams at steven@spfmuni.com or by mail to Specialized Public Finance Inc., 4925 Greenville Avenue, Suite 1350, Dallas, Texas 75206. Subscription to the i-Deal LLC's BIDCOMP Competitive Bidding System is required in order to submit an electronic bid. The City will neither confirm any subscription nor be responsible for the failure of any prospective bidder to subscribe.

An electronic bid made through the facilities of PARITY shall be deemed an irrevocable offer to purchase the Certificates on the terms provided in this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions, and shall be binding upon the bidder as if made by a signed, sealed bid delivered to the City. The City shall not be responsible for any malfunction or mistake made by, or as a result of the use of the facilities of, PARITY, the use of such facilities being the sole risk of the prospective bidder.

If any provisions of this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions shall conflict with information provided by PARITY as the approved provider of electronic bidding services, this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions shall control. Further information about PARITY, including any fee charged, may be obtained from Parity Customer Support, 40 West 23rd Street, 5th Floor, New York, New York 10010, (212) 404-8102.

For purposes of both the written sealed bid process and the electronic bidding process, the time as maintained by PARITY shall constitute the official time. For information purposes only, bidders are requested to state in their electronic bids the True Interest Cost rate to the City, as described under “Basis for Award” below. All electronic bids shall be deemed to incorporate the provisions of this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions and the Official Bid Form.

BIDS BY TELEPHONE . . . Bidders must submit SIGNED Official Bid Forms to Steven Adams, Specialized Public Finance Inc., 4925 Greenville Avenue, Suite 1350, Dallas, Texas 75206, and submit their bid by telephone on the date of the sale.

Telephone bids will be accepted at (214) 373-3911, between 9:00 AM, Central Time and 9:30 AM, Central Time on June 9, 2026.

Specialized Public Finance Inc. will not be responsible for submitting (and will not submit) any bids received after the above deadlines.

Neither the City nor Specialized Public Finance Inc. assume any responsibility or liability with respect to any irregularities associated with the submission of bids if the telephone option is exercised.

PLACE AND TIME OF BID OPENING . . . The bids for the Certificates will be publicly opened and read in the office of the Financial Advisor at 9:30 AM, Central Time, Tuesday, June 9, 2026.

AWARD OF THE CERTIFICATES . . . The City Council of the City (the “City Council”) will take action to award the sale of the Certificates (or reject all bids) and adopt the ordinance authorizing the sale of the Certificates (the “Ordinance”) on June 9, 2026. **The City reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive any irregularities except time of submission, receipt of the Disclosure Form (defined below) or the Publicly Traded Entity Representation (defined below) and filing of the standing letter described within “CONDITIONS OF THE SALE – Standing Letter Requirement.”**

THE CERTIFICATES

DESCRIPTION . . . The Certificates will be dated June 1, 2026 (the “Dated Date”). Interest will accrue from the date of the initial delivery (anticipated to be July 9, 2026) and will be payable on February 15 and August 15 of each year, commencing February 15, 2027, until the earlier of maturity or prior redemption. The Certificates will be issued only in fully registered form in any integral multiple of \$5,000 for any one maturity. The Certificates will mature on February 15 in each year as follows:

OPTIONAL REDEMPTION . . . The City reserves the right, at its option, to redeem Certificates having stated maturities on and after February 15, 2037, in whole or in part in principal amounts of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof, on February 15, 2036, or any date thereafter, at the par value thereof plus accrued interest to the date of redemption. The Certificates may be subject to mandatory redemption in the event the Purchaser (as defined below) elects to aggregate two or more maturities as Term Certificates (as defined below).

SERIAL CERTIFICATES AND/OR TERM CERTIFICATES . . . Bidders may provide that all of the Certificates be issued as serial Certificates or may provide that any two or more consecutive annual principal amounts be combined into one or more term Certificates (the “Term Certificates”). See “CONDITIONS OF THE SALE – Type of Bids and Interest Rates” below.

MANDATORY SINKING FUND REDEMPTION . . . If the successful bidder elects to alter the Maturity Schedule reflected above and convert the principal amounts of the serial Certificates into “Term Certificates”, such “Term Certificates” shall be subject to mandatory redemption on the first February 15 next following the last maturity for the serial Certificates, and annually thereafter on each February 15 until the stated maturity for the Term Certificates at the redemption price of par plus accrued interest to the date of redemption. The principal amounts of the Term Certificates to be redeemed on each mandatory redemption date shall be the principal amounts that would have been due and payable in the Maturity Schedule shown above had no designation of such maturities as Term Certificates occurred.

The Paying Agent/Registrar will select by lot or other customary random selection method the specific Term Certificates (or with respect to Term Certificates having a denomination in excess of \$5,000, each \$5,000 portion thereof) to be redeemed by mandatory redemption. The principal amount of Term Certificates required to be redeemed on any redemption date pursuant to the foregoing mandatory redemption provisions shall be reduced, at the option of the City, by the principal amount of any Term Certificates having the same maturity which have been purchased or redeemed by the City as follows, at least 45 days prior to the mandatory redemption date: (1) if the City directs the Paying Agent/Registrar to purchase Term Certificates with money in the debt service fund for the Certificates (at a price not greater than par plus accrued interest to the date of purchase), then a credit of 100% of the principal amount of such Term Certificates purchased may be made against the next mandatory redemption installment due, or (2) if the City purchases or redeems Term Certificates with other available moneys, then the principal amount of such Term Certificates may be credited against future mandatory redemption installments in any order, and in any annual amount, that the City may direct.

The final Official Statement will incorporate the mandatory redemption provisions for the Certificates in the event the successful bidder elects to convert serial maturities into one or more Term Certificates.

BOOK-ENTRY-ONLY SYSTEM . . . The City intends to utilize the book-entry-only system of The Depository Trust Company (“DTC”). See “THE CERTIFICATES - Book-Entry-Only System” in the Preliminary Official Statement.

PAYING AGENT/REGISTRAR . . . The initial Paying Agent/Registrar shall be Wilmington Trust, N.A., Dallas, Texas. See “THE CERTIFICATES - Paying Agent/Registrar” in the Preliminary Official Statement.

SECURITY FOR PAYMENT . . . The Certificates constitute direct obligations of the City, payable from a continuing, direct annual ad valorem tax levied, within the limits prescribed by law, on all taxable property located within the City.

Further details regarding the Certificates are set forth in the Preliminary Official Statement.

CONDITIONS OF THE SALE

TYPE OF BIDS AND INTEREST RATES . . . The Certificates will be sold in one block on an “All or None” basis, and at a price of not less than 101% and not greater than 107%. Bidders are invited to name the rate(s) of interest to be borne by the Certificates, provided that each rate bid must be in a multiple of 1/8 of 1% or 1/100 of 1% and the net effective interest rate must not exceed 15%. The highest rate bid may not exceed the lowest rate bid by more than 2.5% in rate. For Certificates with stated maturities on or after February 15, 2036, no reoffering yield will be accepted that results in a dollar price less than 98.50 for any individual maturity. The high bidder will be required to submit reoffering yields and dollar prices prior to award. No limitation is imposed upon bidders as to the number of rates or changes which may be used. All Certificates of one maturity must bear one and the same rate. No bids involving supplemental interest rates will be considered.

ADVANCE MODIFICATION OF PRINCIPAL AMOUNTS . . . The Maturity Schedule for the Certificates set forth above represents an estimate of the principal amount of Certificates to be sold. The City hereby reserves the right to change the Maturity Schedule, based on market conditions, prior to the sale. In the event that the City elects to change the Maturity Schedule prior to the sale it will provide notice to potential bidders through Parity. Such notice shall be considered an amendment to this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions.

POST BID MODIFICATION OF PRINCIPAL AMOUNTS . . . After final computation of the bids, in awarding the sale to the best bidder, the City may determine in its sole discretion, that the funds necessary to carry out the purposes for which the Certificates are to be issued may be either more or less than the proceeds of the proposed sale of all of the Certificates. Upon making such a determination, the City reserves the right to adjust the principal amount of the Certificates shown on the Maturity Schedule. The principal amount of any maturity of the Certificates shall only be adjusted in \$5,000 increments, and the aggregate par shall not be increased or decreased by an amount that exceeds 15% of the preliminary aggregate principal amount (rounded up to the next higher integral of \$5,000) without the permission of the successful bidder. Such adjustment(s), if any, shall be made within 4 hours of the opening of the bids for the Certificates.

The successful bidder may not withdraw its bid or change the interest rates bid or the initial reoffering terms as a result of any changes made to the principal amounts within these limits. The dollar amount bid by the successful bidder will be adjusted to reflect any adjustments in the principal amount of the Certificates. The bid price for such an adjustment will reflect changes in the dollar amount of the underwriters’ discount and original issue discount/premium, if any, but will not change the selling compensation per \$1,000 of par amount of the Certificates from the selling compensation that would have been received based on the purchase price in the winning bid and the initial reoffering terms. The interest rates specified by the successful bidder for the various maturities at the initial reoffering terms will not change. The City anticipates that the final annual principal amounts and the final aggregate principal amount of the Certificates will be communicated to the successful bidder within three hours of the City’s receipt of the initial public offering prices and yields for the Certificates.

BASIS FOR AWARD . . . Subject to (i) the City's right to reject any or all bids and to waive any irregularities except time of filing, (ii) receipt of the Disclosure Form and the Publicly Traded Entity Representation and (iii) filing of the standing letter described within “CONDITIONS OF THE SALE – Standing Letter Requirement”, the sale of the Certificates will be awarded to the bidder or syndicate account manager whose name first appears on the Official Bid Form making a bid that conforms to the specifications herein and which produces the lowest True Interest Cost rate to the City (the “Purchaser”). The True Interest Cost rate is that rate which, when used to compute the total present value as of the date of initial delivery of all debt service payments on the Certificates on the basis of semi-annual compounding, produces an amount equal to the sum of the par value of the Certificates. In the event of a bidder's error in interest cost rate calculations, the interest rates and premium, if any, set forth in the Official Bid Form will be considered as the intended bid.

In order to provide the City with information required to be submitted to the Texas Bond Review Board pursuant to Section 1202.008, Texas Government Code, as amended, the Purchaser will be required to provide the City with a breakdown of its “underwriting spread” among the following categories: Takedown, Management Fee (if any), Legal Counsel Fee (if any) and Spread Expenses (if any).

ADDITIONAL CONDITION OF AWARD – DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTED PARTY FORM 1295 . . . Pursuant to Texas Government Code, Section 2252.908 (the “Interested Party Disclosure Act”), the City may not award the Certificates to a bidder unless the bidder either: (a) submits a Certificate of Interested Parties Form 1295 (the “Disclosure Form”) to the City as prescribed by the Texas Ethics Commission (“TEC”), or (b) represents to the City by marking the appropriate box on the signature page of the Official Bid Form that the bidder is a publicly traded business entity or a wholly owned subsidiary of a publicly traded business entity (the

“Publicly Traded Entity Representation”). In the event that the bidder's bid for the Certificates is the best bid received and does not provide the Publicly Traded Entity Representation, the City, acting through its financial advisor, will promptly notify the bidder. That notification will serve as the conditional verbal acceptance of the bid, and the winning bidder must promptly file the materials described below.

Process for completing the Disclosure Form. Reference should be made the Disclosure Form, the rules of the Texas Ethics Commission with respect to the Disclosure Form (the “Disclosure Rules”) and the Interested Party Disclosure Act. Instructional information regarding such matters are set forth at https://www.ethics.state.tx.us/whatsnew/elf_info_form1295.htm. For purposes of completing the Disclosure Form the Purchaser will need the following information: (a) item 2 – name of governmental entity: **City of Bryan, Texas** and (b) item 3 – the identification number assigned to this contract by the City: **Series 2026 CO**, and a description of the services to be provided under the contract: **Purchase of Certificates**. If the bidder does not provide the Publicly Traded Entity Representation, the Interested Party Disclosure Act and the Disclosure Rules require a business entity contracting with the City to complete the form at the TEC Internet “portal” that may be accessed at the url set forth above, and then print, sign, and deliver the Disclosure Form in electronic form to the City at anelson@bryantx.gov with a copy to jkyle@orrick.com. Following the award of the Certificates, if the Disclosure Form is required, the City will acknowledge receipt of the completed Disclosure Form through the TEC website, as required by the law.

Preparations for completion, and the significance of, the reported information. A bidder should take appropriate steps prior to completion of the Disclosure Form to familiarize itself with the Interested Party Disclosure Act, the Disclosure Rules and the Disclosure Form. If the Disclosure Form is required, time will be of the essence in submitting to the City, and no award will be made by the City of the Certificates until a completed Disclosure Form is received. The City reserves the right to reject any bid that is not accompanied by a completed Disclosure Form, as described herein, if the form is required, or the Publicly Traded Entity Representation, if applicable. Neither the City nor its consultants have the ability to verify the information included in a Disclosure Form, and neither have an obligation nor undertake responsibility for advising any bidder with respect to the proper completion of the Disclosure Form. Consequently, an entity intending to bid on the Certificates should consult its own advisors to the extent it deems necessary and be prepared to submit the completed form promptly upon notification from the City that its bid is the conditional winning bid.

STATUTORY REPRESENTATIONS AND COVENANTS . . . By submitting a bid, each bidder makes the following representations and, if its bid is accepted, covenants pursuant to Chapters 2252, 2271, 2274, and 2276, Texas Government Code, as heretofore amended (the “Government Code”). As used therein, “affiliate” means an entity that controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with the bidder within the meaning of SEC Rule 405, 17 C.F.R. § 230.405, and exists to make a profit. If a bidder’s bid is accepted, then liability for breach of any such representation or covenant during the term of the contract for purchase and sale of the Certificates created thereby (the “Purchase Contract”) shall survive until barred by the applicable statute of limitations and shall not be liquidated or otherwise limited by any provision of the bid or this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions, notwithstanding anything herein or therein to the contrary.

Not a Sanctioned Company. Each bidder represents that neither it nor any of its parent company, wholly- or majority-owned subsidiaries, and other affiliates is a company identified on a list prepared and maintained by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts under Section 2252.153 or Section 2270.0201, Government Code. The foregoing representation excludes each bidder and each of its parent company, wholly- or majority-owned subsidiaries, and other affiliates, if any, that the United States government has affirmatively declared to be excluded from its federal sanctions regime relating to Sudan or Iran or any federal sanctions regime relating to a foreign terrorist organization.

No Boycott of Israel. Each bidder hereby verifies that it and its parent company, wholly- or majority-owned subsidiaries, and other affiliates, if any, do not boycott Israel and, if its bid is accepted, will not boycott Israel during the term of the Purchase Contract. As used in the foregoing verification, “boycott Israel” has the meaning provided in Section 2271.001, Government Code.

No Discrimination Against Firearm Entities. Each bidder hereby verifies that it and its parent company, wholly- or majority-owned subsidiaries, and other affiliates, if any, do not have a practice, policy, guidance, or directive that discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association and, if its bid is accepted, will not discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association during the term of the Purchase Contract. As used in the foregoing verification, “discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association” has the meaning provided in Section 2274.001(3), Government Code.

No Boycott of Energy Companies. Each bidder hereby verifies that it and its parent company, wholly- or majority-owned subsidiaries, and other affiliates, if any, do not boycott energy companies and, if its bid is accepted, will not boycott energy companies during the term of the Purchase Contract. As used in the foregoing verification, “boycott energy companies” has the meaning provided in Section 2276.001(1), Government Code.

Standing Letter Requirement. Each prospective bidder must have a standing letter on file with the Municipal Advisory Council of Texas and the Texas Attorney General’s Office as required by the All Bond Counsel Letter of the Texas Attorney General dated November 1, 2023. Bidder agrees that it will not rescind its standing letter at any time before the delivery of the Certificates unless same is immediately replaced with a standing letter meeting the requirements of the above-described All Bond Counsel Letter.

The City reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to reject any bid from a bidder that does not have such standing letter on file as of the deadline for bids for the Certificates. In the event that a bidder does not have such standing letter on file at the time of submission of a bid, the bidder agrees to file such standing letter with the Municipal Advisory Council of Texas and the Texas Attorney General's Office by the earlier of: (a) two (2) hours after submitting its bid, and (b) the deadline for bids for the Certificates.

GOOD FAITH DEPOSIT . . . A Good Faith Deposit, payable to the "City of Bryan, Texas", in the amount of \$1,308,600, is required. Such Good Faith Deposit shall be a wire transfer, bank cashier's check or certified check (which is to be retained uncashed by the City pending the Purchaser's compliance with the terms of the bid and this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions). The Good Faith Deposit may be provided to the City via wire transfer (the City will provide wire instructions to the Purchaser), in the form of a certified or cashier's check made payable to the order of the City in the amount set forth above. The Good Faith Deposit will be retained by the City and: (a) will be applied, without allowance for interest, against the purchase price when the Certificates are delivered to and paid for by such Purchaser, (b) will be retained by the City as liquidated damages if the Purchaser defaults with respect to the bid or (c) will be returned to the Purchaser if the Certificates are not issued by the City for any reason which does not constitute a default by the Purchaser.

DELIVERY OF THE CERTIFICATES AND ACCOMPANYING DOCUMENTS

CUSIP NUMBERS . . . It is anticipated that CUSIP identification numbers will appear on the Certificates, but neither the failure to print or type such number on any Certificate nor any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for a failure or refusal by the Purchaser to accept delivery of and pay for the Certificates in accordance with the terms of this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions and the terms of the Official Bid Form. All expenses in relation to the printing or typing of CUSIP numbers on the Certificates shall be paid by the City; provided, however, that the CUSIP Service Bureau charge for the assignment of the numbers shall be the responsibility of and shall be paid for by the Purchaser.

DELIVERY OF CERTIFICATES . . . Delivery will be accomplished by the issuance of one Initial Certificate (the "Initial Certificate"), either in typed or printed form, in the aggregate principal amount of \$65,430,000*, payable in stated installments to the Purchaser, signed by the Mayor and Secretary of the City, approved by the Attorney General, and registered and signed by the Comptroller of Public Accounts. Upon delivery of the Initial Certificate, it shall be immediately cancelled and one definitive Certificate for each maturity will be registered and delivered only to Cede & Co., and deposited with DTC in connection with DTC's Book-Entry-Only System. Delivery will be at the principal office of the Paying Agent/Registrar in Dallas, Texas. Payment for the Certificates must be made in immediately available funds for unconditional credit to the City, or as otherwise directed by the City. The Purchaser will be given three business days' notice of the time fixed for delivery of the Certificates. It is anticipated that delivery of the Certificates can be made on or about July 9, 2026, and it is understood and agreed that the Purchaser will accept delivery and make payment for the Certificates by 10:00 AM, Central Time, on July 9, 2026, or thereafter on the date the Initial Certificate is tendered for delivery, up to and including July 23, 2026. If for any reason the City is unable to make delivery on or before July 23, 2026, the City shall immediately contact the Purchaser and offer to allow the Purchaser to extend its offer for an additional thirty days. If the Purchaser does not elect to extend its offer within six days thereafter, then its Good Faith Deposit will be returned, and both the City and the Purchaser shall be relieved of any further obligation. In no event shall the City be liable for any damages by reason of its failure to deliver the Certificates, provided such failure is due to circumstances beyond the City's reasonable control.

CONDITIONS TO DELIVERY . . . The obligation of the Purchaser to take up and pay for the Certificates is subject to the Purchaser's receipt of (a) the legal opinion of Orrick, Herrington & Sutcliffe LLP, Austin, Texas, Bond Counsel for the City ("Bond Counsel"), (b) the City's no-litigation certificate, and (c) the City's certification as to the Official Statement, all as further described in the Preliminary Official Statement.

To provide the City with information to enable it to comply with certain conditions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, relating to the exclusion of interest on the Certificates from gross income for federal income tax purposes, the Purchaser will be required to complete, execute, and deliver to the City (no more than two business days after the award of the bid for the Certificates) a certification regarding "issue price" substantially in the form and to the effect attached hereto to this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions, and, prior to delivery of the Certificates, to sign additional certificate(s) and provide additional information as required by Bond Counsel. In the event the successful bidder will not reoffer the Certificates for sale or has not sold a substantial amount of Certificates of any maturity at least 5 business days prior to the delivery date of the Certificates (see "Competitive Bidding and Certificate of Underwriter"), such certificate may be modified in a manner approved by the City and its Bond Counsel. In no event will the City fail to deliver the Certificates as a result of the Purchaser's inability to certify actual sales of Certificates at a particular price prior to delivery. Each bidder, by submitting its bid, agrees to complete, execute, and deliver such a certificate by the delivery date of the Certificates, if its bid is accepted by the City. It will be the responsibility of the Purchaser to institute such syndicate reporting requirements to make such investigation, or otherwise to ascertain the facts necessary to enable it to make such certification with reasonable certainty. Any questions concerning such certification should be directed to Bond Counsel.

COMPETITIVE BIDDING AND CERTIFICATE OF UNDERWRITER . . . In the event that the City does not receive sufficient qualified bids to satisfy the competitive sale requirements of Treasury Regulation § 1.148-1(f)(3)(i), allowing the City to treat the reasonably expected initial offering price to the public as of the sale date as the issue price of the Certificates, the City will treat (i) the first price at which 10 percent of a maturity of the Certificates is sold to the public as the issue price of that maturity (the “10 percent rule”) or (ii) the initial offering price to the public as of the sale date of any maturity of the Certificates as the issue price of that maturity (the “hold the price rule”). If the 10 percent rule has not been satisfied as to any maturity of the Certificates, the Underwriter agrees to promptly report to the City’s financial advisor the prices at which it sells Certificates of that maturity to the public. This reporting obligation shall continue, whether or not the Certificates have been delivered, until the 10 percent rule has been satisfied. The attached Certificate Regarding Issue Price has language for (i) when the competitive sale requirements of Treasury Regulation § 1.148-1(f)(3)(i) are met and (ii) when such requirements are not met.

LEGAL OPINIONS . . . The Certificates are offered when, as and if issued, subject to the approval of the Attorney General of the State of Texas. Delivery of and payment for the Certificates is subject to the receipt by the Purchaser of an opinion of Bond Counsel, to the effect that the Certificates are valid and binding obligations of the City and that the interest on the Certificates will be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes under existing law, subject to the matters described under “TAX MATTERS” in the Preliminary Official Statement.

CERTIFICATION OF OFFICIAL STATEMENT . . . At the time of payment for and initial delivery of the Certificates, the City will execute and deliver to the Purchaser a certificate in the form described in the Preliminary Official Statement under “OTHER INFORMATION – Certification of the Official Statement”.

CHANGE IN TAX EXEMPT STATUS . . . At any time before the Certificates are tendered for delivery, the Purchaser may withdraw its bid if the interest received by private holders on bonds of the same type and character of the Certificates shall be declared to be includable in gross income under present federal income tax laws, either by ruling of the Internal Revenue Service or by a decision of any federal court, or shall be declared taxable or be required to be taken into account in computing any federal income taxes, by the terms of any federal income tax law enacted subsequent to the date of this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions.

GENERAL

FINANCIAL ADVISOR . . . Specialized Public Finance Inc. is employed as Financial Advisor to the City in connection with the issuance of the Certificates. The Financial Advisor's fee for services rendered with respect to the sale of the Certificates is contingent upon the issuance and delivery of the Certificates. Specialized Public Finance Inc., in its capacity as Financial Advisor, does not assume any responsibility for the information, covenants and representations contained in any of the legal documents with respect to the federal income tax status of the Certificates, or the possible impact of any present, pending or future actions taken by any legislative or judicial bodies.

NOT AN OFFER TO SELL . . . This Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions does not alone constitute an offer to sell the Certificates, but is merely notice of the sale of the Certificates. The offer to sell the Certificates is being made by means of this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions, the Official Bid Form and the Preliminary Official Statement. Prospective purchasers are urged to carefully examine the Preliminary Official Statement to determine the investment quality of the Certificates.

ANTICIPATED ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION DEBT . . . The City anticipates the issuance of additional general obligation debt within the next twelve months. See “FINANCIAL INFORMATION – Capital Improvement Program” in the Preliminary Official Statement.

RATING . . . The Certificates are rated “AA+” by S&P Global Ratings, a division of S&P Global Inc. (“S&P”).

THE PRELIMINARY OFFICIAL STATEMENT AND COMPLIANCE WITH SEC RULE 15c2-12 . . . The City will approve and authorize the accompanying Preliminary Official Statement and, for the limited purpose of complying with SEC Rule 15c2-12 (the “Rule”), will deem such Preliminary Official Statement to be final as of its date within the meaning of the Rule. To the best knowledge and belief of the City, the Preliminary Official Statement contains information, including financial information operating data, concerning every entity, enterprise, fund, account, or person that is material to an evaluation of the offering of the Certificates. Representations made and to be made by the City concerning the absence of material misstatements and omissions in the Preliminary Official Statement are addressed elsewhere in this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions and in the Preliminary Official Statement.

The City will furnish to the Purchaser, acting through a designated senior representative, in accordance with instructions received from the Purchaser, within seven (7) business days from the sale date, copies of the final Official Statement in such quantity and in the formats as the Purchaser shall request in order for the Purchaser to comply with Section (b)(4) of the Rule and the rules of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board; provided, however, that the cost of any Official Statements in excess of 50 shall be prepared and distributed at the cost of the Purchaser. The Purchaser shall be responsible for providing in writing the initial reoffering prices and other terms, if any, to the Financial Advisor by the close of the next business day after the award. Except as noted above, the City assumes no responsibility or obligation for the distribution or delivery of any copies of the Preliminary Official Statement or the Official Statement in connection with the offering or reoffering of the Certificates.

CONTINUING DISCLOSURE AGREEMENT . . . The City will agree in the Ordinance to provide annual financial statements and other financial information and operating data, as well as timely notices of certain events in accordance with the Rule, as described in the Official Statement under “CONTINUING DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION”. The Purchaser’s obligation to accept and pay for the Certificates is conditioned upon delivery to the Purchaser or its agent, upon written request, of a certified copy of the Ordinance containing the agreement described under such heading.

COMPLIANCE WITH PRIOR UNDERTAKINGS . . . During the last five years the City has complied in all material respects with its prior continuing disclosure agreements entered into pursuant to the Rule.

ADDITIONAL COPIES OF NOTICE, BID FORM AND PRELIMINARY OFFICIAL STATEMENT . . . A limited number of additional copies of this Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions, the Official Bid Form and the Preliminary Official Statement, as available over and above the normal mailing, may be obtained at the offices of Specialized Public Finance Inc. 4925 Greenville Avenue, Suite 1350, Dallas, Texas 75206, Financial Advisor to the City.

On the date of the sale, the City Council will, in the Ordinance authorizing the issuance of the Certificates, confirm its approval of the Official Statement, and any addenda, supplement or amendment thereto, and authorize its use in the reoffering of the Certificates by the Purchaser.
